

Sugar Grove Committee Overview

Sugar Grove Police Pension Fund

The Police Pension Fund Board consists of a total of five (5) Trustees, two (2) are to be active police officers, one (1) a beneficiary of the fund and two (2) are to be appointed by the Village President. At this time there is an opening for one position to be appointed by the Village President.

The powers and duties of this board, include, but are not limited to:

- Control and manage the Pension Fund
- Investment of funds
- Order payment and issue certificates of payment
- Submit an annual list of fund payments to the Sugar Grove Board of Trustees
- Subpoena witnesses (in cases involving the fund)
- Appoint a Clerk of the Pension Fund Board
- Keep records

Sugar Grove Police Commissioners

The Board of Police Commissioners consists of three members that are appointed by the Village President with the consent of the Board of Trustees.

The powers and duties of this board include the hiring, firing and discipline of law enforcement officers for the Village of Sugar Grove.

Sugar Grove Plan Commission

The Planning Commission consists of seven (7) members. The members are appointed by the Village President subject to approval by the Board of Trustees. Of the members so appointed, six (6) shall be citizens of the village, and one may be a citizen of the township of Sugar Grove, and within territory contiguous to the municipality and not more than one and one-half miles beyond the corporate limits and not included within any other municipality. The Plan Commission is a recommending body; all recommendations are presented to the Village Board for consideration and approval.

The powers and duties of this board, include, but are not limited to:

1. To establish a time for, conduct public hearings on, and prepare recommendations to the village board on the following matters:
 - a. Application for amendments to the zoning district map or the text of the zoning ordinance.
 - b. Special use permits for planned developments, including any requests for exceptions from required standards of this zoning ordinance.
 - c. Zoning requests pertaining to newly annexed property, including review of all plats and plans in connection therewith.

- d. Site plan review for development proposals in commercial, commercial, manufacturing, and manufacturing districts, according to requirements.
- e. Plats of subdivision, including review of such plats for conformance to the comprehensive land use plan, this zoning ordinance, and the subdivision regulations of the village, as may be amended from time to time.
- f. To review the zoning district map for accuracy on an annual basis, so that the zoning district map may be updated annually, and published in the manner required by the Illinois Compiled Statutes.
- g. To prepare and recommend to the corporate authorities, from time to time, plans for specific improvements in pursuance of the official comprehensive plan.

Sugar Grove Architectural Review Group

The Architectural Review Group is an adhoc Committee. The function of this committee is to assist the Village in reviewing retail, commercial, industrial, and governmental buildings. Applicants committee will preferably have an architectural background in retail, commercial, industrial and/or government architecture. When a project is submitted, members are contacted on a rotating basis to form a committee of three for each project. This committee's recommendation is then presented to the Village Board. The Villages planning consultant and the Community Development Director assist the committee. This committee meets during normal business hours and does not meet on a regular basis.

Adhoc (As Needed) Committees

From time to time there may be a need or a desire to select residents/business members to sit on a committee to obtain their input regarding items that may be facing the Village Board. An Adhoc committee is generally composed of 3 to 7 members and meets on an as needed basis. Upon completion of the committee assignment the committee is disbanded.
