Looking back and reflecting on what made us proud in 2010 the first thing that came to mind was our community members. Sugar Grove is a community of hardworking people, people who volunteer, who take pride in their family, their neighborhood, their community, and make Sugar Grove the great place it is to live and work in. The Board and I are proud of our community and the people who feel like we do, that there is no place like home.

2010 brought an expansion of commercial and retail services to the community with the opening of; Ziza Nails, Vision Plus, Division One Fitness, Microtax, Inc., H&R Block, Inc, Sweet Sensations, and Peacock Trading. Local business expansions included the expansion of Quantum Signs and MetroLift and the addition of building in the Sugar Grove Research Park.

West Suburban Bank also began construction and is slated to open in the spring of 2011. The most exciting news is that McDonalds, which the Board approved in December 2010, is expected to open in 2011.

2010 was also a year in which we began to see projects that will setup the future of our community, bringing commercial development and job expansion. A feasibility study for a full interchange at Route 47 and I-88 was completed and submitted to IDOT and the Toll Authority for approval. Once approval is obtained, Phase I Engineering will begin. IDOT is also beginning to plan for improvements to Route 47, including expansion to four (4) lanes from Kennedy Road in Kendall County to Cross Street. Preliminary plans for a Supportive Living Facility for persons with traumatic brain injury were submitted to the Village and also to the State, as required for all new health care facility, expansions, or improvements, for licensing approval.

Sugar Grove's future has a great foundation, one that we will to continue to build on to provide additional services, shopping and dining venues and employment opportunities and yet maintain a quality of life that gives Sugar Grove that small town ambience.

Christmas Tree Pickup Schedule and a Note from Waste Management



Christmas Trees will be picked up on your regular pickup day until the end of January (the week of January 24, 2011). Trees must be free of all decorations, cannot be in plastic bags, and in sections no longer than 5 feet.

Waste Management collects between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. on pickup days. All items must be placed curbside no later than 6 a.m. Separate trucks pickup refuse and recycling and they all operate on different schedules, so each material may be picked up at a different time of the day. Due to the large volume of calls received regarding missed pickups Waste Management Drivers have been instructed to log addresses that do not have refuse at the curb when they pass by. Should a driver need to return Waste Management may charge an additional trip fee. Please contact Waste Management if you have any questions regarding your curbside pickup at 1-800-796-9696.
